GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

This year all classes will be taught at **Irvine High School**. Sign up early. Classes are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. Incomplete registration cards cannot be accepted and will be returned. Make sure your Student ID Number is included on the card. There are no waiting lists for classes once they are closed. Check with the Summer School Office during the first three days of Summer School for openings. Choose your classes carefully, as changes may not be possible. POLICY REGARDING AUDIT OF CLASSES

Any class may be audited under the conditions listed below. An audit means that no grade and no credit is received on the Summer School report card or printed on the NHS transcript.

In order to audit any class, students must complete a "Request to Audit Class" form in the Summer School Office. For ALL classes, deadline to submit Request to Audit Class form: Monday, July 22, 2008 (12:30 p.m.) The form will be validated and returned to you --- be sure and keep it as your receipt. If no request for Audit is received by July 22 students will receive grade and credit for Summer School enrollment.

DESCRIPTION AND LIST OF CLASSES

G = Grade level in Sept. 2008

P = Prerequisite CP = college

* = 3 week class (all other classes are 6 weeks)

ENGLISH

Bridge to Humanities (G 9-10, P = none). This class is designed for students who need to strengthen basic skills in English. Presented are a variety of composition, reading and literature studying activities. Included are the development of skills in, reading comprehension, study skills and active listening. Literature read is entertaining, and writing skills work focuses on the U.C. Writing Process.

Creative Writing 1 (G 9-12, P = none, CP). This class explores various creative writing genres and affords the student practice in a variety of exercises and styles, including the use of literary terminology and technology.

Writing Workshop (G 10-11, P = none). This class is designed for students that need to make-up one semester of the English Humanities CORE as a repeat class.

MATHEMATICS

Algebra 1B (G 9-12, P = repeating only, CP). Operations of real numbers, solving equations, polynomials and fractional expressions. Completion of this course will enable students to enter Geometry in September, depending upon Summer School grade and teacher recommendation.

Geometry B (G 9-12, P = repeating only, CP). Exploration of theorems, proofs and applications. Coupling of algebraic and geometric skills. Completion of this course will enable students to enter either Algebra 2 in September, depending upon Summer School grade and teacher recommendation.

SAT PREP (@ UHS \$170 Fee)

SAT I Prep (G 11-12, P = none). Pass/Fail Grade only. Register At UHS only. Teaches skills and strategies for test taking. Sample/ practice tests are utilized. This six week class consists of three weeks of verbal and three weeks of math instruction, each session with a different teacher. \$170 Fee – Payable to "ICE" There are no refunds for this class after June 1st .

SCIENCE/HEALTH/PE

Health (P = none). Study of health problems, substance abuse, teenage pregnancy, birth control, sexually transmitted diseases, stress management, depression, nutrition/physical fitness/ eating disorders, first aid. Unit on family life also included. Required class for graduation in California. \$170 Fee – Payable to “IUSD” There are no refunds for this class after May 30th .

PE: Life Fitness (G 10-12, P= none) General fitness course that meets the physical education graduation requirement. \$170 Fee – Payable to “ICS” There are no refunds for this class after May 30th. This class will be offered at 1:00 – 3:30PM Monday - Thursday on the NHS campus.

SOCIAL SCIENCE

World History Survey (G 10-12, P = repeat class for Humanities Core-9 World History either semester). Students focus on events occurring in Western Europe from the Renaissance through the Industrial Revolution, plus Imperialism and World War I, and study of development issues with case studies of countries in Latin America, Africa, Asia and the Middle East.

United States History Survey (G 11-12, P = repeat class for US History either semester, CP). Study of major themes and cause/effect relationships in American History in the 20th century.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Please check with your Special Education teacher for information and registration.

VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

Ceramics (G 9-12, P = none, CP). Students will be introduced to ceramic techniques while developing individual skills in analysis of expression and production. Materials Fee \$25 - Check payable to "NHS" There are no refunds for this class after May 30th .

Music Composition, Theory & Technology (G 9-12, P = none, CP). This course will prepare students to enroll in AP Music Theory or those who wish to acquire a broader understanding of music. The course integrates aspects of melody, harmony, texture, rhythm, form history and style in music. Computer MIDI technology will be explored along with music composition and theory software.

WORLD LANGUAGES

Spanish 1B (G 9-12, P = repeat for students wishing to improve their grade or prepare for level 2, CP). Students successfully completing this class are eligible to take Spanish 2A in the fall.

Spanish 2B (G 9-12, P = repeat for students wishing to improve their grade or prepare for level 3, CP). Students successfully completing this class are eligible to take Spanish 3A in the fall.

The Coastline Regional Occupational Program (ROP) will offer a wide variety of classes during Summer 2008: Medical/Nursing Internship; Dental Radiology; Culinary Arts; Animal Health; and Hotel and Tourism.
